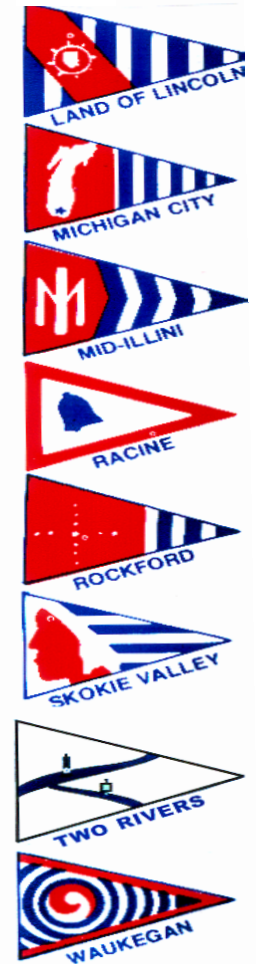
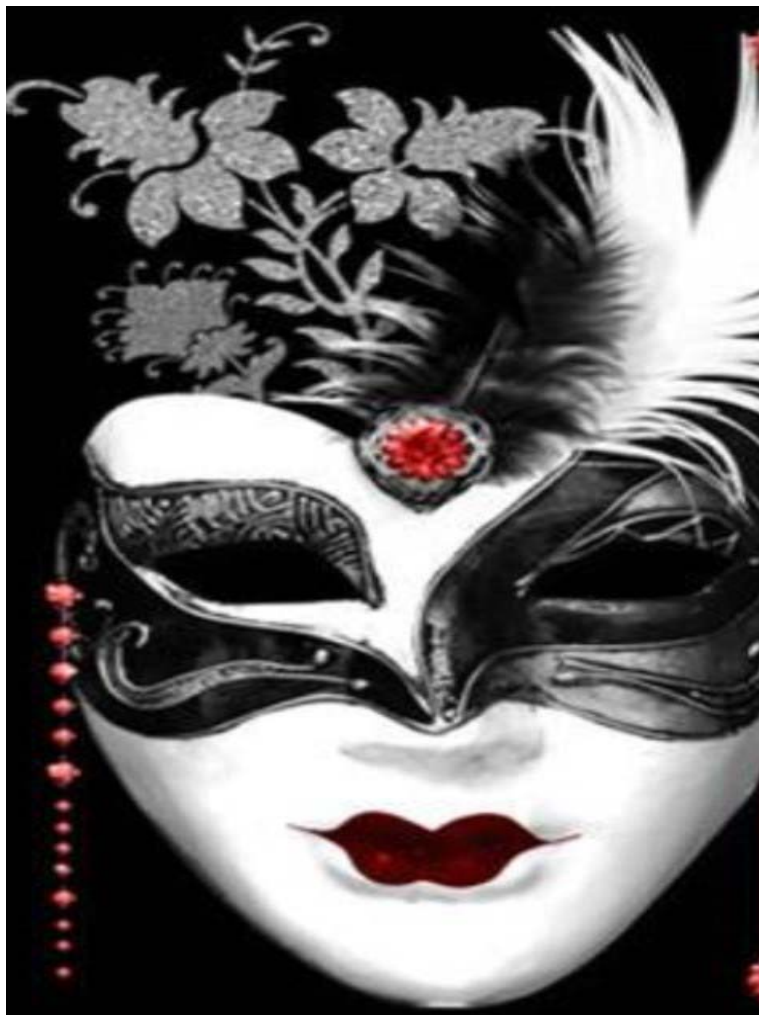
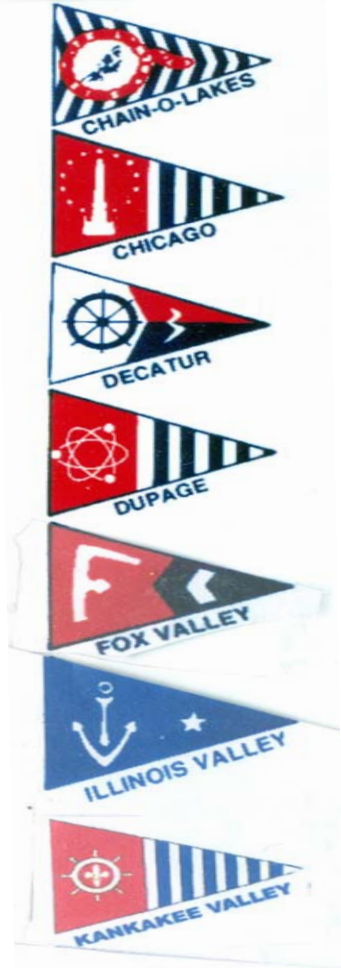

Normally boating season comes to a halt at this time of year. Unfortunately on the Illinois River boating never got off to a good start in 2015 with high water and severe flooding. After the floods ebbed, the river had a lot of floating debris making boating conditions rather scary. Recreational boating on the Illinois River during the 2015 boating season was probably down 75% from 2014. Recreational boating prior to this year had already dropped by nearly three quarters of the number of boats on the river compared to eight to ten years ago. Ten years ago we would see more than a hundred boats on the river and Peoria Lake on weekend days. This past summer if we would see eight or ten boats and two dozen recreational boats at a time it was a rare sight. I did Vessel Safety Checks on at least ten boats that did not leave the marina all summer. Let's hope for better conditions for boating in 2016.

On a brighter theme, the D/20 Fall Conference at Bloomington was a festive party and a very well executed conference and council. Commander Pat did great work keeping the meetings moving within the constraints of time. Everyone I spoke with after the meetings were well satisfied with the results. Kudos to the Mid-Illini Squad that ran a well oiled machine for the weekend. The Commander's meeting was lively as we discussed opportunities our squadrons might seize upon to spur growth in our organization. We also discussed possible deterrents to our success and how we might handle or prevent them. Thanks to all the commanders who contributed to the discussion and ideas. We are blessed with a good group of squadron leaders in D/20.

The D/20 Cruise and Rendezvous for 2016 will be at the IVY Club in Peoria on 30 July 2016. Stay tuned as Illinois Valley prepares their brochure and presentation for this event. # Extra Boat Show Volunteers Needed

USPS will have a Boating Skills Virtual Trainer (VT) simulator at the Chicago Boat, RV & Strictly Sail Show, scheduled 14-18 January 2016. We expect this will draw a lot of attention and more visitors to the USPS booth this year, so the Boat Show Committee is asking for extra volunteers.



The Boating Skills simulator is an award winning training unit that allows students to practice maneuvering a boat on an open lake, docking and other exercises. It is very realistic with three large 3D monitors, steering wheel and throttle. In fact, the Boating Skills VT simulator received the 2015 Innovations Award from NASBLA.

In all, USPS has 18 Boating Skills simulators developed through a grant from the U.S. Coast Guard. Working with the National Marine Mfg Association, simulators are being shipped to major boat shows across the country. USPS is the only organization that has a simulator for public demonstration, and it will be advertised by the show, drawing many visitors to our booth.

Volunteers receive free admission to the Boat Show on the day you volunteer. If you are interested in lending a hand and learning to use the new Boat Skills simulator, contact Jim Geske

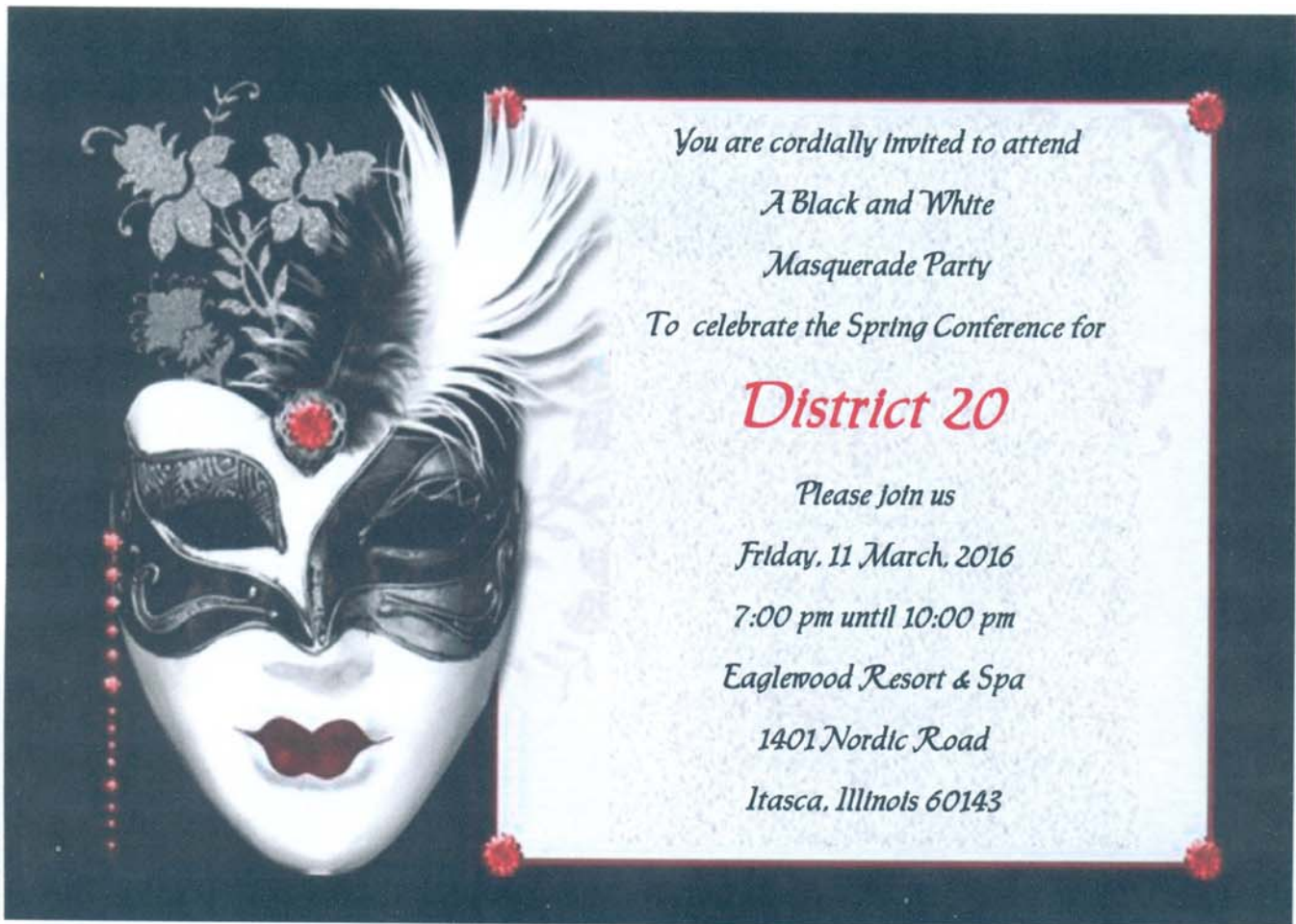
