PHOTOGRAPH RELEASES

The USPS Law committee developed two permission forms that should be used when publishing a picture in newsletters or boating class publicity. Both of these forms, when filled out, should be retained for future questions about picture usage. You will find these forms on Sail Angle in the D/20 File Cabinet and in the file named "Forms". They are listed as:

- 1. Model Release—used when a minor is in a picture
- 2. Photographer License—permission to use a photographers material.

Actually, no picture should be used without the subject's permission. This goes even for squadron members at a squadron function. In this case, you don't have to get individual permission slips. However, at the start of a function something like "Would anyone object to having their picture taken today/tonight?" would be a good announcement. Most people will agree, but someone may have a good reason not to have their picture taken, with no further explanations needed or given.


Here's a reminder from R/C Bob Howd of the Membership Committee:

How's your boating been this summer? It's a question which frequently sparks a conversation between boaters, especially among boaters in the Midwest where the season is painfully brief. Ask me—your district commander—and I have a one word answer: non-existent!

The job of the D/C is demanding. There's always another conference to arrange, a cruise and rendezvous to plan, and/or an August Governing Board to attend. There goes that time affectionately

phrased "the boating season".

I managed a trip to the Arctic Circle! You may think that's exceptional. The planning for it was in the works—and a deposit down—long before becoming D/C. I want to share a few thoughts of that adventure with you.

Opportunities for sextant sights locally are sorely limited—primarily due to a lack or horizon. Not so on a cruise up the coast of Norway. Deck 10 and higher of *Queen Elizabeth* provided 360 degrees of horizon. Height of eye was another issue.

Yes, packing my sextant was a priority for this trip. I packed a Davis Mark 25 plastic sextant,

mindful of the fact that TSA—our airport security might consider my more precise Astra III Professional sextant some kind of security threat. The Mark 25 indicated 15 minutes of index error. The Astra III none. The Mark fit nicely into my USPS canvass valise, and became my carry-on luggage.

If you've taken JN, you may recall those blank rectangular boxes and/or hash marks found in the Nautical Almanac on the right half of the daily pages showing twilight. They're found during July at latitudes north of 60 degrees and higher. I should have checked before packing the sextant. One "night" Laura Jean and I watched the sun set at 2330 ship's time. It may have been later. I had set my watch to Greenwich Mean Time. We were at E014 degrees, 23.8 minutes, a time zone later (midnight sun).

Queen Elizabeth cruised past the Arctic Circle, visiting the ports of Bodo (N67 degrees, 17.5 minutes) and Narvik, well north of the Circle. Take out your map and check. The tradition is that a vessel initially

crossing the Circle has its bow painted blue. The bow rail of *Elizabeth* was blue blessed.

I took several sun sites (LAN). I'd been advised sun sites on a moving vessel are subject to errors. I have yet to reduce them to test their accuracy. Hopefully a cold winter day here in Chicago will provide that opportunity. Final thought: The North Sea state was consistently calm (2 to 3 feet), with air temperatures of 55 degrees throughout the entire cruise.

Upon returning to our port of departure, Southampton, England, the wife and I were off to London and other items on our bucket lists: hers was Harrods and mine


Greenwich. I'll save my Greenwich adventures for another time. I proudly sport my souvenir tee shirt printed 000 degrees, 00 minutes, 00 seconds, World's Prime Meridian. Ask me to show it to you. I'll wear it at February's USPS Annual Meeting in Orlando.

2018 USPS GOVERNING BOARD, Minneapolis MN

12-19 August, 2018

Minneapolis was close enough that most of our members in attendance traveled by car. The hotel accommodations were excellent and everyone had a good time. The D/20 Bridge members returned with lots of information to pass on at the Fall conference. It was reported at the meeting that the total count for USPS on July 31, 2017 was 27,245 and July 31, 2018 was 24,934 for a loss of 8.5%. D/20 in the same time period went from 652 members down to 618 for a loss of 5.2%. Not as bad as the national average, but still not healthy. The national advertising campaign does not seem to be providing the increase in membership as hoped. Perhaps the name change will help.

National offered several interesting side tours for members to see a little of the area. The Mall of America was a huge hit. On Thursday evening there was a dinner cruise on the lake that was very enjoyable. The next Governing Board conference will be held in Louisville KY. The meetings have never been held there (in my memory) so they should be able to schedule a lot of fun activities to go along with the business sessions. It may also increase participation since it is a different venue.





Keep Your Personal Information Up-To-Date

Your squadron and the district keep your address, phone and email address up-to-date by using the information stored in national's database. It is, therefore, important that you keep the information accurate that you are able to change.

From the main website, <u>www.usps.org</u>, choose "Member's Log In" and log in using your certificate number and the PIN supplied to you on your renewal invoice. If you do not know your PIN, choose the "forgot your password?" link, and follow the steps provided.

Once logged in, you will be taken to the "Member Profile" page. Click on the "Manage Profile" button. Sadly, due to some current transition issues between web pages from the new USPS website and the old website, you will need to log in a second time using your certificate and PIN. You will be taken to a page, and redirected to a different page (again, part of the transition), and finally will be placed on the "Managing Your Personal Information" page.

You can change several things, and many things you cannot. From top to bottom, you can change the way your rank and grade will display and if you get these options figured out, I'd love to learn what the differences are because I don't completely

understand the options. You can add a nickname for yourself and choose whether you prefer that over your normal name. You can choose whether to receive benefit announcements or not and what your gender is, what your birthday is and how to display it.

Then we actually get to the important stuff. Your address, two phone numbers, whether those can receive texts, whether they are OK to call, and your email address! This is important, we need you to tell us your email address. That is the way almost all information is disseminated from your squadron, the district and national. Without it, you are missing out on a lot of information about the organization.

Finally, you can specify your MMSI, Ham call sign, significant other's name, gender and certificate. You can also specify your boat type, name and home port.

Other data about you is maintained by others. Your squadron secretary will maintain whether you are an officer or are on any committees. National will maintain grades and dates for courses.

PLEASE keep your contact information up-to-date. Thank you.
