MuVIT Boating Simulator


The MuVit Boating Simulator was introduced at the February Annual Meeting in Orlando. It is a laptop program that can be displayed on a large monitor. Combined with a throttle and steering wheel it is a low cost version of the bulky and expensive simulator that has been around for a few years.

The MuVIT system can be purchased for about \$2,000 to \$2,500. Contact Scott Morris at Tampa Power Squadron for a firm quote.

Join USPS Growing Cruise Group for Feb. 2024



ENSURING PROPER CONFIGURATION OF DIGITAL SELECTIVE CALLING (DSC)-EQUIPPED RADIOS

The Coast Guard strongly recommends that vessel owners, operators, and crewmembers with DSCequipped VHF radios:

- Obtain and properly register an MMSI number. Information to obtain/register a MMSI number can be found at https://www.navcen.uscg.gov/maritime-mobile-service-identity.
- Ensure that your GPS and DSC-equipped radio are interconnected. Doing so may save your life in a distress situation! All DSC-equipped radios, and most GPS receivers, have an NMEA 0183 two-wire data protocol which allows for any model of GPS to be successfully interconnected to any model of radio, regardless of manufacturer. Before interconnecting your radio & GPS, consult the owner's manuals. America's Boating Channel Urges Use of Engine Cut-Off Devices

Are you aware of the legal requirement for using engine cut-off devices? This is a requirement that could save your life.



The requirement to use an engine cut-off switch (ECOS)

took effect on April 1, 2021, and applies to all U.S. waterways, with fines of \$100, \$250, and \$500 for the first, second, and third offenses, respectively. State and local authorities may choose to enforce the law differently, but using an engine cut-off switch is now the law for qualified vessels everywhere in the United States.

The law applies to all personal watercraft and recreational boats under 26 feet with motors capable of 115 pounds of static thrust (a little under 3 horsepower). Boats not currently equipped



with an engine cut-off switch are exempt, but that grandfather clause is closing fast. Another recent federal law required manufacturers to install engine cut-off switches on all new boats starting in January 2020.

Videos are available that offer an overview of the importance of specialized safety equipment for recreational boating that will shut down the engine in an emergency such as the boat operator falling overboard. America's

Boating Channel[™] produced these videos to help viewers learn about traditional lanyard type devices, as well as the new wireless systems.

Watching videos like <u>"Engine Cut-Off Devices</u>" (<u>https://youtu.be/3J3M8dMzqTk</u>) is an excellent way for boaters to prepare for safer experiences on the water. America's Boating Channel also produced a sequel entitled <u>"Wear an ECOS"</u> (<u>https://youtu.be/i0Nu7Gu-JG0</u>). It covers differences between boating knowledge and boating skills and why it matters. Viewers learn approaches to take to improve their boating abilities.







Inexpensive and expandable – The MuVIT boating simulator.

Tired of expensive boating simulators that just don't have all the functions, controls, and capabilities you need or want? Do you need more types and sizes of boats including sail, PWC's, trawlers, or cruisers? Better instrumentation such as fish finder type depth, a chart plotter, NMEA interface to OpenCPN? Need scenery that is real places with real data? If you answered yes then read on.

So, what is the MuVIT boating simulator?

Originally built as a tool to enhance the Tampa Power Squadrons (a unit of the United States Power Squadrons) boating safety courses, the multivessel interactive trainer or MuVIT boating simulator was developed as a low-cost and easily transported boating simulator built with off-theshelf components and software that you can purchase yourself to build your own simulator platform.

As currently implemented, Tampa's MuVIT boating simulator provides a full-featured simulated boating experience while maintaining a modest cost. Any size screen is supported as long as your computer can interface with it. The wheel and control panel/throttles can be packed into one small rolling case. The CPU is a commodity laptop that any squadron should have available, not an expensive gaming laptop. We currently run on an HP4540s is laptop, this model was new in 2010 and it performs just fine. Rather than retire that old laptop, repurpose it to be a boating simulator for boat shows or classroom demonstrations.
