America's Boating Channel celebrated the first anniversary of its smart TV service offerings with a **Safe Boating Video Fiesta at the 2024 International Boating & Water Safety Summit** (IBWSS). It was announced during the summit that the Canadian Power & Sail Squadrons is America's Boating Channel's newest strategic content provider partner.



Have you checked out the 12 Inlet Drone Videos (IDVs)? IDVs combine aerial video footage and 3D chart animations to help recreational boaters plan their first sorties through challenging and dangerous U.S. waterway entrances. Let me take a quick minute to introduce myself and tell you about my journey with United States Power Squadron. My then girlfriend Karen (now my wife) and I joined Skokie Valley Power Squadron in 1990. In the 33 years I worked my way up the squadron bridge and am on my 3<sup>rd</sup> term as Commander. Most know me as the husband of P/D/C Karen D'Amico, and I've been very happy being there for her during her journey with USPS. Now I'm taking my turn at doing what I can to support USPS and D20.

Let's move on to business. At the last Annual Meeting, there were some new programs and items that I would like to pass on to our membership. The 2 items I wish to touch on are VSC Examiners and New Marketing material.

The first item that I would like to share is related to VSC Examiners. A new Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) Between USCGAux and USPS states that all current VSC Examiners need to take a mandatory workshop and sign an attestation to be completed by 30 June 2024 to retain their certification. P/D/C Mike Ludtke, SN-CAN has graciously accepted to be the D20 VSC Chair this year again and has mentioned the possibility of teaching a VSC Examiner's class later this year. The VSC trifold brochure produced by the Marketing Committee was just updated for 2024. Remember, the VSC is not just about the boat; it is an opportunity to educate. The brochure includes a checklist of required items on the boat and other safety tips. Use the space on the back to fill in your contact information, class schedule, or next squadron activity before printing them.

The next item I want to touch on is Marketing's effort to help promote USPS.

The Co-Operative Advertising Program has returned for 2023 – 2024. This program is to help squadrons and districts partially fund their advertising by offering reimbursement for 50% of

qualified advertising and promotional dollars, up to a maximum of \$300 per squadron (or district) per year.

Qualified advertising can include the following:

Paid advertising for radio, TV, social media or print media. Printed materials such as flyers, letters, posters, and placemats.

Billboards, banners, or signs that promote courses.

Materials for boat shows, parades, trade show displays, and local festivals.

Qualified expenditures must be submitted by September 1, 2024, for the current fiscal year. Additional information can be found at <a href="https://www.usps.org/departments/12000/12400">https://www.usps.org/departments/12000/12400</a>.

To help in promoting America's Boating Course and USPS there are now "fillable" marketing brochures. The space on the back of the brochures are "fillable" meaning there is a space to type in your club's contact information, class schedule, events, etc. before printing. The trifold brochures are a great resource for boat shows, classes, and other PR activities. Chapman Award: The Charles F. Chapman Award is a National award recognizing excellence in teaching. District 20 may nominate 1 or 2 candidates. The District 20 nomination(s) are due at National no later than 1 October 2024. Squadrons are encouraged to submit candidates to D20 for consideration and nomination. #### National Course Development

<u>Cruising & Cruise Planning</u>: Release of the completely updated and expanded Cruising & Cruise Planning course is imminent. A team-teaching approach to presenting this course is recommended due the broad scope of the expanded curriculum.

<u>Advanced Marine Navigation</u>: Update of this curriculum is under active development with release expected by the end of 2024.

<u>Celestial Navigation</u>: Development is continuing on the Celestial Navigation course which will replace the current Navigation (N) course. Availability for beta testing is anticipated later this year. The requirement to pass this 10-week course will be successful completion of a detailed sight folder; no exam will be required. The current N course will continue to be available until the new Celestial Navigation course is released.

Boat Systems: The Boat Systems committee is developing seminars on Diesel Engines, Outboards, and Marine Batteries. Content from these seminars is expected to be incorporated in future updates of the <u>Engine Maintenance</u> and <u>Marine Electrical Systems</u> courses. A new webinar on NMEA 2000 and NMEA 0183 networks is also under development.

Course Completions: Congratulations are in order for the following recent course completions: P/D/C Mike Ludtke recently taught the new Offshore Navigation course in beta form with 8 students who are now anxiously awaiting exam results!
